- 4. Describe the two natures of Christ and their importance.
- 5. What does sanctification mean?
- 6. Briefly discuss the rest of God.
- 7. Summarize the three main differences between the Old Testament and New Testament priesthoods given in your textbook.
- 8. Melchisedec was the king of Salem and also a priest of God. Why was this unique and different in contrast to the Levitical priesthood?
- 9. With the changing of the priesthood, of necessity, there had to be a change of dispensation too. Why was this necessary?
- 10. If the first covenant had been able to accomplish what God wanted and make people perfect, then there would have been no need whatsoever for a second covenant. Why, then, did God institute the first covenant?
- 11. Why were there several Levitical sacrifices and not just one?
